Special instructions:

- 1. PARKING on ULM campus in the U-shaped parking area between Sugar and Hanna Halls. Enter from University Ave. at the large Arkansas Stone ULM sign. Walker Hall, the tall building with the Arkansas stone and stained glass tower, is at the top of the U. Dr. Carr will speak will speak with campus police ahead of time.
- 2. Dr. Carr recommends rubber boots, as we will be working the edges of the lake. Insect repellent, of course, and although we will be near the forest, some of you might need hats and/or sunscreen.
